Chief Ryan Delcore was born in Dallas, Texas on July 22, 1975 and raised in Greenville, Texas. He entered Naval Service on July 6, 1994, attending Recruit Training in Great Lakes, Illinois. He next completed Seaman Apprenticeship School, also in Great Lakes.

Chief Delcore's first sea tour was onboard USS Edenton (ATS 1) from 1994 to 1996 as a deck seaman. The Edenton decommissioned and he then reported aboard USS Patriot (MCM 7) home ported in Sasebo, Japan where he served from 1996 to 1998 as a Damage Controlman 3rd Class, later cross-rating to Illustrator Draftsman and finishing up his three-year sea tour in Sasebo aboard USS Belleau-Wood (LHA 3) from 1998 to 1999. Chief Delcore reported to Supreme Allied Command, Atlantic in Norfolk, Virginia where he served from 1999 to 2002. Chief Delcore reported to USS Kitty Hawk (CV 63) where he served from 2002 to 2005. His next tour was as a Basic Multimedia Illustrator Course instructor at the Defense Information School (DINFOS) in Fort Meade, Maryland from 2005 to 2008. He completed the Public Affairs Qualification Course at DINFOS before transferring to Naval Mobile Construction Battalion ONE THIRTY-THREE in Gulfport, Mississippi as the public affairs officer from 2008 to 2011.

Chief Delcore reported to his current command aboard USS George Washington (CVN 73) where he is leading chief petty officer of the ship's Media Department.

Chief Delcore's personal awards include the Joint Service Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Joint Service Achievement Medal (4 awards), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, and other campaign and unit awards. He has been designated an Enlisted Warfare Specialist, Enlisted Air Warfare Specialist, Seabee Combat Warfare Specialist, and Master Training Specialist. He is a qualified Basic Parachutist.

Chief Delcore is married to the former Yumi Eguchi and they have a daughter, Yula.
